BRIEF INTRODUCTION OF THE ORGANIZATION

Western Region Social Service Forum (WRSSF)

WRSSF - is the Social Development Wing of the Western Region Bishop's Council. It was initiated in 1996 and was registered in the year 2001 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and the Bombay Public Trust Act 1950. The Governing Body of WRSSF consists of 8 people who provide continuous direction and guidance for the Organization's policies and programs. The General Body of WRSSF consists of all the Catholic Bishops of the Western Region and all the Directors of the partner Diocesan Social Service Societies (DSSS) of the Western Region.

WRSSF works with 15 Partner NGOs of Maharashtra, Gujarat and Goa. WRSSF as a coordinating and facilitating Organization inspires, animates, supports and promotes the developmental interventions of 15 Diocesan Social Service Society partners for the integral development of people without any bias to caste, gender, religion, creed and linguistic groups so that they may individually and collectively reach the fullness of their growth. The Organization implements programs based on the developmental needs the 4 four zones of its operational area - Gujarat, Marathwada, Konkan and Vidharbha.

WRSSF has been promoting developmental interventions and building capacities of the partner organizations on various social issues such as HIV/AIDS, Farmers Suicides, Human Trafficking, Right to Food Livelihood options, human-made and natural disasters etc. The Organization also conducts several capacity building programs by analyzing the social situations through Regional and Diocesan Perspective plans.

WRSSF operates from its Office at Sarvodaya, St. Pius College Campus, Aarey Road, Goregaon (E), in Mumbai.

Main Objectives of WRSSF

- To promote and facilitate integrated human development.
- To train personnel for promoting social development activities
- To promote activities connected with ecological and environmental concerns.
- To develop and disseminate IEC materials in the field of developmental work
- To conduct research, documentation, seminars, training courses and furthering the objectives of the forum.
- To collaborate, net work and liaison with the Government and Non-Governemental Organizations towards achieving the goals of the Organization

CAPACITY ENHANCEMENT OF THE PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS:

apacity enhancement in the Development Sector is a continuous process by which an Organization develops its own strengths and the strengths of its Partner Organizations to maximize the positive impacts of the Organizations' service delivery to the stakeholders by improving the Internal Management Systems as well as the Human Resource capacity scale-ups.

WRSSF's Capacity Enhancement Program (CEP) aims at strengthening the capacities of the of the partner Organizations by providing opportunities for upgrading their skills and knowledge for better dissemination of information, program development, partnership enhancement, implementation and evaluation of development programs, etc through trainings, workshops, learning exchange programs and study trips.

WRSSF took up a Capacity Enhancement Program from 1" July 2009 till 30th June, 2012 with the financial support from Caritas India, New Delhi. During the implementation period of this project, WRSSF through different program activities ensured that the partner DSSS Organizations begin to be more and more professional, efficient and innovative organizations. The CEP project also helped the 15 partner organizations to broad-base their advocacy, networking and partnership building efforts in the Development Sector.

Workshop on Local Resource Mobilization Strategies:

und raising is an art and most of the NGOs do not have the required expertise in fund mobilization especially Local Resource Mobilization. On the other hand, over the past years, the Indian Voluntary Sector Social Development Organizations have been experiencing absence of adequate funding support for implementing numerous innovate programs. Hence, WRSSF decided to address this pressing need of the Partner Organizations by organizing capacity building trainings on Local Resource Mobilization. Accordingly, WRSSF Mumbai organized a 3-day workshop on Local Resource Mobilization from 13th to 15th June 2011 at Sarvodaya, Mumbai. The workshop was facilitated by Ms. Nisha Purshottaman of Think Strategic Organization, Banglaore. The Directors and the Program Coordinators of 13 Partner Organizations attended the 3-day workshop.

- Understanding the importance and techniques of communicating NGOs work

Key Achievements:

The participants of the Partner Organizations were exposed to different elements of brand building, Appeal letters formulation, Thank You letter writing, use of Social media for fundraising, ways of approaching the CSR funding, Annual Report preparation, building the Credibility of the Organizations and indeed the buzzwords of transparency and accountability in the Social Development Organizations.

Partner Organization level follow-up of the LRM workshop:

- Kalyan DSSS called for a sharing meeting with the Bishop and the program partners and shared the workshop contents and leanings. The DSSS has designed Visiting card, Annual report and Brochure for resource mobilization events. It also participated in Mumbai Marathon. It helped to Karunya Trust to bring more visibility to the organization in the social sector
- WRSSF developed a 3 minutes CD on its activities for Corporate Sector presentation aimed at tapping CSR resources
- Vasai DSSS developed Appeal Letters based on the learnings from the LRM workshop and approached different organizations for local fund mobilization.
- Sindhudurg DSSS mobilized Rs. 3,50,000/- by telephone contacts.
- Aurangabad DSSS developed Appeal Letters for fund raising from local institutions from the district of Aurangabad.

Livelihood and Entrepreneurship Development Workshop:

Intrepreneurship development workshop is to alleviate poverty through enhancing livelihood options and entrepreneurial skill of potentials of urban and rural youth

WRSSF conducted a 4-day workshop on Livelihood Entrepreneurship and Skill Development for the benefit of the members of its 15 Partner Organizations. This workshop was conducted from 20th to 24th June 2011 at Aubhav Centre, Mira Road, Mumbai. 35 people took advantage of this workshop which was facilitated by the Resource Team from I Create Organization, Bangalore. The topics dealt with during the workshop were - Qualities of an Entrepreneur, Idea to Execution, Music of Business, Market Research, Sales & Marketing, Cost-benefit analysis, Quality control, Communication skills, etc.

Partner Organization level follow-up of the Livelihood Entrepreneurship workshop:

 Rajkot DSSS imparted this training knowledge to 15 SHGs at Morbid and Chachana, and 10 people have already started business like tea shops, pappad making, Soap making in their own villages

- 1-day workshop was organized by Aurangabad DSSS on Livelihood and Entrepreneurship development for SHGs on 26th Aug. 2011 at Disha Vikas Kendra, Aurangabad
- Kalyan DSSS facilitated the submission of 37 proposals from Ambernath and Kalyan to the bank for obtaining loans and 21 proposals were sanctioned for livelihood promotion by BPL families.

ith the objective of strengthening the capacities of the directors and senior managerial level staff of the Partner Organizations, WRSSF conducted a 4-day workshop on Managerial Skills and Strategic Plan from 12th to 15th July 2011 at Sarvodaya, Mumbai. The workshop was facilitated by Fr. Paul Vaz sj and Mr. Ravindra Dey professors of Xavier Institute of Management, Mumbai. 25 Directors/Assistant Directors from 15 Diocesan Social Service Societies took advantage of the 4-day workshop.

- All the participating Partner Organizations have fine tuned some of their working strategies in their respective organizations
- Some of the Partner Organizations have formulated different workplace/organizational policies such as Gender Policy, Finance Policy based on the policies of WRSSE.

Emergency Response Support Team building Workshops:

RSSF together with Caritas India and CRS played the lead role for involving the grass-root level Voluntary Organizations for responding more effectively and efficiently to the different natural and human-made calamities such as floods, droughts, earth quakes, communal tension, etc. As part of this initiative, WRSSF conducted 2 workshops (March 2011 & Jan. 2012) for the partner organizations and also facilitated the formation of Emergency Response Support Teams (ERST) in the 3 States of Goa, Gujarat and Maharashtra.

Col. Vishwas Supnekar, Director of Disaster Management Department in Yashwantrao Chavan Academy of Development Administration, Mr. Mandar Vaidya, RedR India and Prof. Irshad and Prof Balamurgan from Tata Institute of Social Science facilitated the different workshops on Emergency Response Support Team building programs conducted by WRSSF.

Partner Organization level-follow up of the ERST Workshop:

 Aurangabad Diocesan Social Service Society organized a 1-day ERST training at Auranagabad on 10th March 2012 under a guidance of Mr. Tushar Pradan District Disaster management Officer (DDMO) of Aurangabad District. 20 representatives from Paithan, Phulmbry, Gagapur, Kannad, Khultabad, Basi Gaivrai and Aurangabd Taluka were present for the training.

WRSSF'S NEW PROJECT FOR THE YEAR 2011-2012:

C.1: VIVHAAN PILOT PROJECT:

pilot project named "Vivhaan" which means
'the dawn of a new day' or 'new beginning' in
Hindi, was initiated by WRSSF from March
2011 to June 2012. This pilot project seeks to address
the major issue of Human Trafficking by:

- Providing information to women and girls in impoverished communities to raise awareness on human trafficking and to empower them to make informed decisions about their future
- Bringing a greater level of co-ordination among the different stakeholders engaged in fight human trafficking across the country by gathering information on trafficking activities.

The consortium of Nimbus Organization and Stop Human Trafficking Organization selected WRSSF to implement this pilot Vivhaan program in the Western Region. Accordingly, WRSSF selected 5 Partner Organizations for implementing this Pilot Project namely - Center For Social Action of the Archdiocese of Mumbai, Karunya Trust of the Diocese of Kalyan, Jahit Trust of the Diocese of Vasai, Navjeeven Trust of the Diocese of Rajkot and Poona Diocesan Social Service Society of the Diocese of Pune.

Once again I thank all the bishops and directors and the staff for their collaboration, I wish all the very best for Fr Jolly.


